

The 2019 FIFA Women's World Cup **A1+**



The U.S.A. won its third World Cup in Canada in 2015.

The eighth edition of the FIFA Women's World Cup will be held in France from 7 June to 7 July. It will be the **biggest women's tournament** ever. There are 24 teams competing, double the number for the first tournament.

The teams first play a group round before possibly progressing to the round of 16, quarter-finals, semi-finals and final.

Firsts

There are four teams competing for the first time in a World Cup: Chile, Jamaica, Scotland and South Africa. The Jamaican team developed with financial help from the Bob Marley Foundation. The musician was an enormous football fan, so his daughter Cedella is happy she can help the national team.


