

But every year, he returns to the place Jack Thornton died, to remember his friend. American author Jack London wrote about Buck in The Call of the Wild in 1903. In his adventurous life, London went to the Yukon to prospect for gold in 1897. He didn't find gold and he only just survived: he had no food. ■

#### The Klondike Gold Rush (1896-1899)

Prospectors found gold in the Klondike River, in the Yukon region of Canada, in 1896. 100,000 people travelled the isolated region but very few got rich.
