Irish Magic Teacher's Notes



Originally, Artemis Fowl was the first of eight fantasy novels by Irish author Eoin Colfer. It was adapted for the cinema by Kenneth Branagh and finally released on Disney+ after being delayed by lockdown. It features first-time actors as well as experienced and even very experienced actors like Judi Dench who plays the part of the leader of the fairy police. We think the story is motivating for A2 pupils and a good starting point for interaction. Pupils will discover the trailer, a clip and an article.

Listening, speaking, writing

- We suggest starting with two easy vocabulary activities to get everyone ready for the trailer.
- Make sure numbers and supernatural creatures are pronounced correctly. Then, show the trailer without giving any information about the movie. Just say "Ce're going to watch a trailer. Before watching, read the questions in Activity B". The questions are all about visual elements, so don't try to work on the words, although some will probably recognise "our world...in danger" or "you are not prepared". To finish Activity B, have pupils report to their group or the class what they know up to now

about the hero and the places.

Reading, writing, acting.

- Assuming you are actually in class, we suggest working in groups (some pupils might prefer to work on their own until they get to the acting activity) and gradually sharing the information with the class.
- The role play should not take up too much time. Your help will be required to check the pronunciation and fluency.
